# I Am the Echo

# **Wey Theme:**

You were never meant to be silent—you were meant to echo Heaven. God's voice is still speaking, and He wants to echo His truth, His love, and His grace through your life.

## **Opening Question:**

Have you ever felt like someone else's words or actions were exactly what you needed in that moment—like God was using them to speak directly to you? What do you think it means to be *an echo* of God's voice in someone else's life?

# 1. God's Voice Echoes Through History, Creation, and People

**Hebrews 1:1-3 (NLT)** 

1 Long ago God spoke many times and in many ways to our ancestors through the prophets. 2 And now in these final days, he has spoken to us through his Son. God promised everything to the Son as an inheritance, and through the Son he created the universe. 3 The Son radiates God's own glory and expresses the very character of God, and he sustains everything by the mighty power of his command. When he had cleansed us from our sins, he sat down in the place of honor at the right hand of the majestic God in heaven.

### **P** Discussion Questions:

- What does it mean that Jesus is the *echo* of God's voice?
- Can you look back over your life and recognize moments when God was speaking, even if you didn't hear it clearly at the time?

#### Point to Make:

God is not silent. He is still speaking—through His Word, His Spirit, and His people. The question isn't "Is God speaking?" It's "Am I listening... and am I echoing back?"

#### 2. We Are Called to Echo God's Voice

Romans 1:16-17 (NLT)

16 For I am not ashamed of this Good News about Christ. It is the power of God at work, saving everyone who believes—the Jew first and also the Gentile. 17 This Good News tells us how God makes us right in his sight. This is accomplished from start to finish by faith. As the Scriptures say, "It is through faith that a righteous person has life."

### **P** Discussion Questions:

- How do your words and actions reflect who God is to the world around you?
- Can you think of a time when someone echoed God's truth to you and it changed your direction?

# Point to Make:

God echoes His message of love and truth through us—our testimony, our actions, and the power of the Spirit in our lives. Your voice might be the only Gospel someone hears.

# 3. Your Life Is Echoing Something—Make Sure It's the **Right Voice**

**John 10:27-28 (NLT)** 

27 My sheep listen to my voice; I know them, and they follow me. 28 I give them eternal life, and they will never perish. No one can snatch them away from me.

#### **P** Discussion Questions:

- What does your life echo most loudly—fear, frustration, or faith?
- How can you make sure your reactions and choices are echoing God's truth and not your past pain?
- What areas of your life need to be tuned back in to God's voice?

#### Point to Make:

Everyone's life echoes something. Make sure yours echoes *mercy*, *grace*, *truth*, and hope. When we're close to the Shepherd, we echo His voice.



# **Final Reflection:**

Take a moment to ask yourself:

- Am I listening for God's voice—or only for what I want to hear?
- What message is my life echoing to the people around me?
- Who around me needs to hear Heaven's voice through my voice?



# A Prayer:

Lord, make me a true echo of Your voice. Help me to reflect Your love, Your power, and Your message to the world around me. Open my ears to hear You, and open my heart to respond. Let my life speak louder than my words. In Jesus' name, Amen.
