Midweek Discussion Guide: "Tomorrow About This Time"

Example 2 Key Theme:

God can bring breakthrough and deliverance in an instant. No matter how dire the situation looks, His power is not limited by time, resources, or circumstances.

Opening Question:

Have you ever been in a situation where you felt completely surrounded, with no way out? What did you do?

In **2 Kings 7**, the people of Samaria were in an impossible situation. They were surrounded by the enemy, cut off from supplies, and left to starve. Things were so bad that people resorted to eating inedible and unthinkable things. (Dove Dung - Donkey heads) It looked like the end. **But then, the word of the Lord came**— "Tomorrow about this time," everything would change. **One word from God can shift everything!**

What if your breakthrough is just a day away?

What if God is already at work, preparing your deliverance—even though you can't see it yet?

1. Are You Living in Faith or Doubt?

John 11:40 -

"Jesus said to her, 'Did I not say to you that if you believe, you will see the glory of God?'"

Discussion Questions:

 The advisor to the king doubted God's promise and, as a result, missed out on the miracle. Why do you think people struggle to believe in God's power? Have you ever witnessed God work in someone else's life while you were still waiting for your own breakthrough? How did that affect your faith?



Point to Make:

Faith unlocks the promises of God. Doubt can cause us to miss out on what He wants to do in our lives.

2. Breakthrough Comes in an Instant

Isaiah 60:22 –

"At the right time, I, the Lord, will make it happen."

Discussion Questions:

- The people of Samaria were starving and trapped, but in **one day**, everything changed. What does this show us about God's ability to bring sudden transformation?
- Why do we sometimes expect God to take a long time to fix our problems? How does this passage challenge that mindset?

Noint to Make:

Your situation may look hopeless, but God is not limited by time. He can turn things around overnight!

3. The Danger of Pretending Everything is Okay

Psalm 34:18 –

"The Lord is near to the brokenhearted and saves those who are crushed in spirit."

Discussion Questions:

- The king of Samaria wore royal robes on the outside but had sackcloth underneath. What does this symbolize about how people often hide their struggles?
- Have you ever put on a "mask" to make it seem like everything was okay when it wasn't?
- How can we create a culture where people feel safe to be real about their struggles in the church?

Point to Make:

God isn't fooled by outward appearances. He sees our **hearts**, and He wants us to bring our real struggles to Him.

4. When the Enemy Fears What God is Doing

Romans 8:31 -

"If God is for us, who can be against us?"

2 Kings 7:6 –

"For the Lord had caused the army of the Arameans to hear a sound of chariots, horses, and a great army, so they said to one another, 'Behold, the king of Israel has hired the kings of the Hittites and the kings of the Egyptians against us, to attack us!' So they got up and fled at twilight."

Discussion Questions:

- The enemy ran away before the battle even started! What does this reveal about God's power?
- What are some ways the enemy tries to intimidate us into thinking we're defeated when victory is actually near?



Point to Make:

Sometimes the battle is already won before we even lift a finger—because God fights for us.

Closing – Your Miracle is at the Door



"Now to Him who is able to do far more abundantly beyond all that we ask or think, according to the power that works within us."

Discussion Questions:

- The lepers almost missed their blessing because they were afraid to move. How does fear keep us from stepping into what God has already prepared?
- What are some areas in your life where God is calling you to step forward in faith?

Noint to Make:

Your breakthrough may be closer than you think! Don't doubt—walk in faith.

Closing Thoughts & Challenge:

- This week, take **one step of faith** toward something God has promised you.
- Declare over your life: "Tomorrow about this time, I will see God's hand at work!"
- **Pray for someone who is struggling to believe**—be an encouragement to them.

Final Thought:

If you believe, you will see it. Don't be like the advisor who doubted—be like the lepers who moved forward and found the blessing waiting!
