Key Theme: God is actively seeking us, drawing us toward Hin	n,
and calling us into relationship. Our response should be a	
wholehearted pursuit of Him.	

Opening Question:

Have you ever lost something valuable and searched for it desperately?

- How did you feel when you finally found it?
- What does this teach us about the way God seeks us?

(Transition: Just like we search for what is valuable, God seeks after us. Let's explore how He does this in Scripture.)

1. Scripture Focus: God's Pursuit of Us

Discussion Questions:

- What does this verse reveal about Jesus' mission?
- How do we see God actively seeking people in the Bible?
- Have you ever felt like God was pursuing you? What was that like?

Noint to Make: Jesus didn't wait for us to come to Him—He came looking for us! His love is relentless, always drawing people back to Him.

"And ye shall seek me, and find me, when ye shall search for me with all your heart."

Discussion Questions:

- What does it mean to seek God "with all your heart"?
- · What are some things that can distract us from truly seeking God?
- How can we actively pursue a deeper relationship with Him in our daily lives?

Point to Make:

God isn't hiding from us—He wants to be found! When we truly desire Him, we'll experience His presence and direction in our lives.

3 Living It Out: Walking in a Relationship with God

James 4	1:8 (K.	JV)

"Draw nigh to God, and he will draw nigh to you."

Discussion Questions:

- What are practical ways we can "draw near to God"?
- · How does seeking God impact our daily choices and struggles?
- · What changes when we live with the awareness that God is constantly pursuing us?

Point to Make:

Seeking God isn't just about prayer and reading the Bible—it's about surrendering every part of our lives to Him. The more we move toward Him, the more we experience His love and guidance.

4. Scripture Focus: Worship as Seeking and Surrender

John 4:23-24 (KJV)

"But the hour cometh, and now is, when the true worshippers shall worship the Father in spirit and in truth: for the Father seeketh such to worship him. God is a Spirit: and they that worship him must worship him in spirit and in truth."

Discussion Questions:

- What does it mean that God is seeking true worshippers?
- How is worship more than just singing in church?
- How does true worship involve surrendering to God's will rather than just going through religious motions?

Point to Make:

- Worship is a lifestyle of seeking God, surrendering to Him, and aligning with His truth.
- God is actively looking for those who will truly seek Him—not just in church, but in their hearts and daily lives.

? Closing Thoughts & Challenge:

This week, be intentional about seeking God.

It is possible to know all about worship through church, group, songs, and even spiritual things, while not knowing God both in spirit and in truth. This Plays out when we settle for Revelation of Worship, with out a life changing revelation of Jesus.

- Take time in prayer, asking Him to reveal Himself to you.
- Read His Word with an open Bible and an open heart.
- · Notice the ways He is drawing you closer.

God has already taken the first step in seeking us—will we respond by seeking Him?
